
Background

Incident Analysis



Halifax Transit By-law T-1200

Four key focus areas of the proposed by-law:

- 1. Enhanced Passenger and Employee Safety
- 2. Foster a Positive Passenger Experience
- 3. Ensure Efficient Transit Operations
- 4. Preservation of Transit Property



By-Law Implementation Plan

The Halifax Transit By-law implementation will have two approaches:

- 1. Voluntary Compliance: informal resolutions and warnings.
- 2. Enforcement: fines, removal, and banning.

Halifax Transit will work with HRP, RCMP, and other business partners for the support and implementation of the plan.



Recommendation

It is recommended that Halifax Regional Council adopt By-law T-1200, the purpose of which is to promote the safety, wellbeing, and comfort of passengers and employees of Halifax Transit, as set out in Attachment 1 of this report.
