Shaoqiu Gong, Planner I gave a presentation and responded to questions of clarification from the Committee.

The Committee applied the heritage building criteria in performing the heritage evaluation and provided the following scoring:

# 9.1.2 Case HRTG-2023-00201: Substantial Alteration to St Mark's Church, a registered municipal heritage property at 5522 Russell Street, Halifax

The following was before the Committee:

Seamus McGreal, Principal Planner gave a presentation and responded to questions of clarification from the Committee. McGreal spoke to the adaptive reuse of the building, physical separation of the new building to the church, and details regarding building massing and architectural harmony.

THAT the Heritage Advisory Committee recommend that Halifax Regional Council approve the proposed substantial alteration to the municipal heritage property at 5522 Russell Street, Halifax, as set out in the staff report dated July 17, 2024.

McGreal distinguished a complementary features approach to heritage architectural design from a distinguishable features approach and noted that the developer opted to proceed with the latter approach for the proposed substantial alteration.

Some members expressed concerns regarding building massing and architectural features expressing that they did not complement the heritage building. Other members expressed appreciation for the design's treatment of the heritage features.
