Education and Outreach

Halifax Solid Waste offers free presentations and workshops to schools, universities, businesses and community groups. Presentations are customized to each classroom or organization and can often connect to curriculum outcomes or badge requirements. Through these interactive sessions, participants will learn:

- the importance of the 3Rs
- how to generate less waste
- the impact of landfills
- how to properly sort waste
- what happens to waste after it leaves the curb
- the impact of individual actions
- how to conduct waste audits
- how to compost at home
- how to educate others in their school or workplace
- how to find efficiencies in your recycling program
- how to host a green event

Upgrades to Farrell Park Pathway



In response to safety concerns in the area of the Farrell Park pathway, a Crime Prevention through Environmental Design (CEPTED) audit was done for the area. CEPTED audits are provided by members of the Community Response

Team of the Halifax Regional Police and offer suggestions to help reduce the chances of crime. The pathway is well used as a major connection point from the residential area to the more commercial area of Wyse Road; and, is in the heart of this older residential section of Dartmouth.

HRM staff have cut out all underbrush along the playground area and lifted the canopy of remaining mature trees to improve sightlines. The access points from the residential units abutting the park have been cut back and widened to improve sightlines and reduce concealed areas. A general clean up of the sight has been completed removing 3 1/2-ton truck loads of litter and illegal dumping. The vegetation encroaching on the walkway itself was cut back. The massive multi-flora roses on each side just outside the fence will remain as they provide an impassable barrier and help keep the fence line secure. An extra light pole has been added and all lights converted to LED. I am currently discussing with Nova Scotia Power (property owner) the possibility of creating a public park for this area.

New Public Walkway for Skeena Street to Saguenay Place

A paved walkway is being installed between Skeena Street and Saquenay Place. The work will involve tie-in to driveways and some lawn slopes with most of the work being done within the HRM Right-of-way (ROW). All efforts are being taken to reduce impact to private property during construction.




Road Work Projects in District 6

The Dartmouth North Public Library and Community Centre has been the heart of the community since 1995. The time has come for some improvements to offer better programs in a more modern environment. This \$1,000,000.00 project has been made possible through a grant from the TD Common Ground Project, Federal Funding and HRM Capital Funding. Phase 1 centers around outdoor improvements including: a furnished outdoor library; new playground; improved landscaping with improved walkways; improved accessibility and free 24-hour Wi-Fi. Phase 2 of the renovation project -interior changes - will begin in late 2018. Details of the inside renovation are still being decided. 

Beazley Basketball Courts and Skateboard Area



Tender no. 17-075 has been awarded to Ocean Contractors for the reconstruction of the basketball and skate park area of the Beazley Field Complex on Caledonia Road.

The first step in the project will be to demolish the existing concrete slab (the remaining floor of an indoor ice rink that was demolished) and prepare a new stable base.

Construction will then commence on two asphalt basketball courts complete with fencing and nets. A new concrete pad will be poured adjacent to the basketball courts for the skate parks. The existing skate board ramps will be removed prior to the beginning of construction and re-installed on the new pad by HRM staff.

The site work will also include the installation of new park benches shaded by beech trees and new asphalt walkways.

As of July 13, 2017, the 311 HRM Customer Contact Centre has revised its hours of operation as follows: Monday to Friday, 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Saturday and Sunday, 9 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Exceptions: Closed on Christmas and New Year's Day.

This change, approved by Regional Council on February 15, 2017 as part of the 2017-18 multi-year budget process, means additional contact centre representatives will be available during the hours when 311 receives its highest volume of calls.
